- Founded on July 18,1878 in Paris by delegates from seven national associations Belgium, France, Germany,
 Great Britain, Italy, Spain and Switzerland.
- UN-recognized non-government organization (NGO).
- Premier international organization representing the interests of surveyors worldwide.
- It is a federation of the national member associations and covers the whole range of professional fields within the global surveying, geomatics, geodesy and geo-information community.
- Representing more than 120 countries throughout the world.
- The FIG's aim is to ensure that the disciplines of surveying and all who practice them meet the needs of the markets and communities that they serve
- The FIG provides an international forum for discussion and development aiming to promote professional practice and standards

Definition of a Surveyor

A surveyor is a professional person with the academic qualifications and technical expertise to conduct one, or more, of the following activities; to determine, measure and represent land, three-dimensional objects, point-fields and trajectories; to assemble and interpret land and geographically related information, to use that information for the planning and efficient administration of the land, the sea and any structures thereon; and, to conduct research into the above practices and to develop them.

 - To translate a sustainable development agenda into action.

- First piloted in 2022
 - FIG Young Surveyors Network (YSN) and the FIG African Regional Network(ARN)
 - Strategic and conceptual support and IP from the Surveying and Spatial Sciences Institute, Australia (SSSI) Mentoring Program.
- Aims to understand the elements required to make mentoring programs a success within this context.
- End goal is to be able to scale up the mentoring program for more participants within Africa and to provide a model of delivery which may be replicated in other regions of the world.

SAYSN History

- The SAYSN was officially launched on the 24th of August, 2012
- Many of the founding members are still actively involved in the surveying industry
- The network then aimed at having active involvement of young surveyors in the profession
- The network was largely involved in various activities during industry conferences such as AfricaGeo and the Geomatics Indaba
- Facebook group the main platform for engagement and communication













SAYSN History

- Several attempts to relaunch the network between 2019 and 2020
- First relaunch events planned for Gauteng and Limpopo
- SAYSN renamed SAYGN (South African Young Geomatics Network, and again renamed South African Young Geomaticians' Network (inclusion))
- Challenge to attract coordinators from other provinces
- Communication limited to Facebook page


